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As environmental destruction and climate change ravage the globe, can we do more than lament?

WAKTU BATU. RUMAH YANG TERBAKAR (WB.RYT) is an intermedial performance that shatters perceptions of what theatre can be. An interplay between stage, cinematography and video game, audiences bear witness to the interplay of mythology, colonial history, capitalism and patriarchy in forming our ecological grief.

With a narrative based on Javanese mythology and history, WB.RYT invites audiences to delve into the intricate transitional situations of Indonesia's contemporary society, rife with layers, cultural ruptures and environmental devastation.

Directed by prominent director Yudi Ahmad Tajudin in collaboration with

writer and dramaturg Urogran Prasad, this latest version of Teater Garasi's Waktu Batu involves collaboration with interdisciplinary artists such as Mella Jaarsma, DJ Y-Dra, pop-rock band Majelis Lidah Berduri, visual designers Deden Bulqini, Tomy Herseta and Tri Rimbawan, as well as nine intergenerational performers.

The house is on fire, so be prepared to plunge into its introspective flames.

Teater Garasi

Teater Garasi is an Indonesian interdisciplinary performance collective that uses performing arts as a conduit to reflect on social, political, economic and cultural issues in our ever-transforming world. A 2013 Prince Claus laureate, they have been honoured for "their adventurous spirit and groundbreaking work in stimulating performance arts in



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Directed by prominent director Yudi Ahmad Tajudin in collaboration with

Southeast Asia". The collective have made waves in the international performing arts circuit (Singapore, Australia, Japan, Germany, United States, etc).

Garasi Performance Institute is an initiative by the collective, to create a sustainable creative environment for performing artists in Indonesia and Asia through knowledge sharing, performance laboratories, archiving, publishing, artist-in-residence programmes and more. Since their inception, Teater Garasi have been conscious modernisers of Indonesian theatre for over 30 years.

Switchblade Op: A World in the City

Kongsi Petak

MALAYSIA

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Amongst the hustle and bustle of the city, past and present collide.

Switchblade Op is an exchange platform that reactivates and reinterprets Malaysian pioneer contemporary dance archives, to preserve history and showcase artistic evolution. In its second edition, Loke Soh Kim's *A WORLD IN THE CITY*, which was first presented at Komtar Auditorium A in 1994, returns to George Town for its 30-year anniversary as a full-length hour-long dance performance.

Reworked to respond to current contexts with a new line-up of dancers, *A WORLD IN THE CITY* follows a man made voiceless and incapable of controlling his own destiny. He lives in a world where his body and mind are made to obey and follow, where dreams never come true and his survival is all that matters.

It is time to reflect on modern life, to reconsider one's place under the all-consuming fast-paced urbanisation.

In this world in the city, the frustrations of our everyday reality are laid bare through the human body's raw movements.



Kongsi Petak

Kongsi Petak began as a member of Kongsi Kolab in Kongsikl's artspace. Kongsi Petak believes in the importance of sharing and exchange, while maintaining a symbiotic relationship with the space they occupy. They foster interdisciplinary collaborations, nurturing talents and promoting knowledge exchange through various platforms like 'Seni Tiga' multidisciplinary project (2019-2022). Kongsi Petak was founded by acclaimed contemporary dance choreographer Loke Soh Kim, who has toured and performed in countries such as China, Canada, Japan, Singapore and the United States.

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DOUBLE BILL OF JINGJU MAGIC consists of two excerpts: "Avenging Zidu" and "Zhuangzi Tests His Wife". Traditional opera meets modern theatre as these pieces examine the many facets of human nature, exploring the paradox of life and death, right and wrong, and cause and effect.

Dubbed "Eastern Macbeth" and considered one of the most challenging plays for wusheng (martial arts male role), "Avenging Zidu" is a tragedy dramatising the damaging psychological effects of ambition and jealousy. Witness a lightning-fast display of seemingly impossible physical feats and acrobatic stunts from award-winning wusheng Li Jia-de. Despite the heavy costume pieces, each movement he executes defies belief, showcasing skill, agility, precision and strength that push the very limits of human capability.

"Zhuangzi Tests His Wife" sees the philosopher Zhuangzi faking his death to test his wife Tian's fidelity. Ling Chia-lin gives a commanding performance as Tian, placing the internal conflict of the female character at the very core of the play. Zhuangzi brings two paper effigies to life to keep an eye on his wife, but once they become flesh and blood, who can keep them in check?

Not only is there magic in the plot, but Jingju actors themselves become spellcasters. The stage is their domain, where they create a captivating fantasy with their distinctive artistic approach. Within the confined space of a minimalist stage, they evoke audiences' imaginations with their stylised actions, bringing all things in the universe to life—be they mountains and rivers, grand palaces and small temples, realistic forms of living creatures or ethereal gods and ghosts.

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A ball masked and armed to the teeth. An irreverent musical on the razor's edge. A toy weapon for playing war. And finally, a miniature desert.

ALLE ARMI does not speak of this or other wars; it is an experiment. Audiences are thrown into a toy supermarket, invited to explore the political and economic issue of the international arms market, a topic which has become dramatically current. Without relying on words but instead through the performative use of toys, ALLE ARMI will contaminate techniques and codes in search of a meeting point between civil and object theatre.

As they blur the boundaries between arms and toys, Hombre Collettivo invites audiences to consider the narrative possibilities of images and objects. The whimsical, childlike world of toys has always drawn nourishment from the world of weapons and war, but the inverse is rarely

explored. By amplifying the evocative power of toys and objects, ALLE ARMI is not just a title, but a formula: a declaration of intent and simultaneously a cry of alarm.

Originating in 2019 from the Animateria Professional Puppetry course, Hombre Collettivo thrives on researching and experimenting with different puppetry languages and techniques. The group focuses on the intersection between civil and political theatre and puppetry, particularly object theatre and visual theatre. Premiering in 2023, their new work ALLE ARMI was selected for the 2024 International Theatre Festival of Kerala (India) and International Theatre Festival Valise (Poland).





They ride a scooter through the city to buy ingredients. While they shop, the sights, smells and sounds of the market draw out the distinctive atmosphere of life in Taipei, the city's charms permeating the air. As they prepare the food, the two grow closer, becoming more intimately entangled with one another.

This non-verbal performance uses a suitcase as a small-scale backdrop, the closeness between audience and puppeteer reflecting the closed distance between the man and the woman.

Since its premiere at the Microfestival Fa. Versteeg in the Netherlands in 2019, A SUITCASE OF TAIPEI has toured at festivals such as the International Puppet Arts Festival in Saguenay, Canada.

After participating in several large-scale puppet shows, puppet designer Liang Mong Han and puppeteer Chen Chia-Hao joined forces to establish Puppet on the Workbench, focusing on small-scale puppet shows. Neighborhood Performance Group, Nineties Production and Noise Performance House come together to collaborate in depth for the very first time, creating a unique site-specific experience. Directed and co-produced by Ong Han Loon, JOURNAL OF HER HOUSE is a George Town Festival co-production taking place in Journal Georgetown.

Underneath Journal Georgetown's visage lies a rich history. The space was once the house of a *Majie*, women who migrated from China to work as domestic servants. They fashioned their hair like married women through certain rituals, displaying their commitment to not marry.

This theatrical collaboration transforms Journal's heritage building into

an immersive historic storytelling experience. Audiences navigate through maze-like spaces, experiencing the challenges and dilemmas of *Majie*.

Ong Han Loon

Ong Han Loon possesses a broad range of experience in the performing arts, including roles as a director, playwright, actor and vocal coach. 

In puppetry performances, where does the puppeteer end and the puppet begin?

In JE M'ÉVANOIS, the puppeteer does not only control the puppet, she becomes an integral part of the puppet itself. Her hands breathe life into his limbs, while her legs form his feet. Their performance speaks of the fragility of human existence, telling the tale of one man's life and the situations he got into.

With a human-sized puppet created by artist Martynas Lukošius, the show is driven entirely by movement and non-verbal acting. Performer Agnė Muralytė looks for a relationship with the puppet both as a puppeteer and as a character, allowing herself to appear and disappear behind the puppet.

A simple story that is poetic, sensitive yet comic, JE M'ÉVANOIS is where puppet and puppeteer literally become one.

Agné Muralytė is a performer working with both theatre companies and as an independent artist taking part in educational and socially engaged artistic projects. Her professional interests lie in theatrical movement, body expression and working with objects. DECLINING ARTISANS is a sculpture series capturing traditional artisans at work, their breaths and their measured movements. Since the 20th century, many tradespeople have set up shop in Penang, quietly cultivating their skills and passing them on to the next generation. Today, Penang boasts over fifty types of traditional trades, however many have disappeared over the years, due to rising rental costs and lack of succession following the passing of artisans.

Traditional trades inject soul and charm into George Town's old houses. If a house loses its soul, only an empty shell is left behind. How can we recall the warm atmosphere that once filled these houses with life?

Through sculptures depicting tradespeople, **DECLINING ARTISANS** invites viewers to feel the atmosphere that once thrived within these buildings, and step into the lives of traditional artisans in little George Town.

Low Chee Peng

Penang-born Low Chee Peng is a self-taught sculptor of 30 years experience. He has represented Malaysia in the Asia Contemporary Sculptors International Exchange (China, 2013) and the Oita Asia Sculpture Exhibition (Japan, 2016). He won the Jury Award in the first Online International Sculpture Symposium in 2020, and his work has been collected by the National Art Gallery and Penang State Art Museum. Chee Peng's works celebrate the human, the marks people make in their community. His works are a reminder to treasure the local, the small-scaled, and the seemingly ordinary.



A mirror stands before you. Instead of seeing yourself, you hear the sound of a heartbeat, your reflection distorted with every thump.

PRESERVING MEMORIES is a sound sculpture installation by Kaito Sakuma, in which liquid mirrors will be placed at locations throughout George Town. The liquid mirror is an acoustic sculpture that functions as both a speaker and a reflective surface, distorting the scenery it mirrors in tandem with the sounds it emits.

Like how scents evoke memories, the mirror invites viewers to recall something "alive" within themselves - whether it is a personal memory, or a cherished time spent with loved ones. As viewers watch the stainless steel mirror surface jolt and dance along to sounds, PRESERVING MEMORIES encourages everyone to take a moment to pause, reflect on the present

moment, and take in the here and now.

Kaito Sakuma

Kaito Sakuma is a sound artist across multiple fields, from digital media to real space. Driven by the theme "raw existence", he creates sound spaces that spark thoughts and expand cognition. Known for his mirror speakers (otherwise referred to as liquid mirrors), Kaito was awarded the Newcomer's Award at the Japan Media Arts Festival 2021. He has toured and exhibited around the world, and has recently relocated to Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia.

LIVING MACHINES is an interactive spatial installation that delves into the intersection of machines and the organic world.

With their sensors and motors, the installation's post-organic machines mimic life's basic functions. They exist in a standby state, breathing and pulsing with a semblance of life, their lights mimicking breaths as their limb-like branches sway.

As you engage with the machines, they seem to come alive, spreading their limbs as if welcoming you. Through machines that teeter between the organic and the inorganic, LIVING MACHINES invites you to question your relationship with the machine.

How does the human experience shape living machines, and what do machine lives offer in return?

If a utopia, an unattainable perfect world, is an island that cannot be reached, aren't we constantly in water, endlessly swimming?

This is a participatory project by the artist during her artist-in-residency in Salettl, Vienna. It is a continuation of her research on islands as a symbol of utopia, exploring swimming as a means of becoming closer to our utopia and as a symbol of social movement. During the residency, Cheng invited participants to picture their own ideal society and swim towards an island she built while carrying items representing their own utopia.

The process was documented and edited into this three-channelled video installation.

Paulus Supomo was not your typical artist. The late 66-year-old illustrator, armed with A2 paper and felt tip markers, portrayed the casual lives of people in the real world and social media.

After spending most of his life as a factory worker in Bandung and only drawing as a hobby, Supomo delved into an invigorating journey of artistic and self-discovery. Collaborating with his son, he broke boundaries, becoming one of Indonesia's hippest illustrators. His work became a way for him to reconnect with his Tionghoa Indonesian roots.

Despite his passing in 2021, Supomo's legacy remains. This exhibition features 25 original works by Supomo that capture not only aspects of society, but also his bond with his son.

Seni Kanji

Supomo began hand lettering in 2016 and became a full-time artist in 2019, while his son Yulius Iskandar created the @senikanji Instagram account. Collaborating with brands, artists and musicians, Seni Kanji presents vintage Chinese poster-like artworks, with Chinese sentences that translate from Indonesian.

Muhammad Irfan (AKA Irfan Popish)

Muhamad Irfan is a writer, music subculture researcher and organiser. Moving to Taiwan to pursue a Masters in Inter-Asia Cultural Studies, he was involved in the exchange of youth cultures between Indonesia and Taiwan.





This group exhibition showcases mixed media sculptures, depicting artisans in George Town working on their crafts. From rattan and cane weaving to songkok making, viewers are invited to reminisce about the lives of these master artisans.

SAME SAME BUT DIFFERENT is a collection of iconic elements found between two states in two different countries. His works encompass flatness, sculptural elements, abstraction and more. Incorporating Eastern materials like paper and calligraphy, his works evoke subtlety and poetry in equal measure.





Artists are invited for a one-to two-month residency, with accommodation and working space provided by George Town Festival. Over the course of their residency, the artists form their own unique interpretations of the city, each viewing the city through a different lens and responding to the festival's overarching theme "Here & Now". Through dynamic interactions with the city and its people, they will transform their experiences into compelling works that will join the festival line-up.

The ARTIST-IN-RESIDENCE programme is one of the highlights of GTF 2024. Three artists, selected through an open call, embark on a journey of creative expression. Immersing themselves in the heart of George Town, they will have a one-of-a-kind residency experience.

PENANG HYBRID FREQUENCY is born from the interaction between human, environmental, social and cultural surroundings in an experimental process. The artist becomes a human recorder, his five senses recording the sights, sounds, smells and feelings of George Town. His observations will be codified into local data concepts, and turned into musical instruments through collaborations with local communities. Culminating in a musical performance, this project responds to and is a reminder of the pressing issues affecting the present.

Juan Arminandi is a musician, composer and instrument builder who finds and creates authentic sounds from one-of-a-kind self-made instruments, created from recycled materials in response to environmental issues. He has had residencies in France, United States and Berlin, and has performed across Indonesia and at the Holland Festival in Amsterdam.

FROM SOMEWHERE INSIDE will search for traces of living that are shown through people, their belongings, their environment and their everyday lives. By entering dwellings and areas where local communities live, the artist observes, chats and exchanges thoughts and feelings with the people that inhabit George Town's historical spaces. In this participatory project, she collects items from locals, items brimming with memories and untold stories. Turning these conversations and objects into content for the creative process, the resulting artwork captures moments in the lives of individuals, allowing the viewer to see their space through the eyes of an outsider.

Charuwan Noprumpha is a visual artist whose work begins with impressions of nature and the observation of everyday life, translating them in abstract ways through form, line and colour. She has had solo and group exhibitions in Thailand, France, Germany and Belgium.

GEORGIE PORGLA & ANG KOO KUEH encourages us to think about food waste. It is a contemplative gastronomic invitation, to appreciate the beauty of food and honour their journey from soil to table and back to compost. Gathering fruit and vegetable cuttings from the heart of George Town, the project highlights how our food waste speaks a thousand words about our place in the world, about where we are in time. At the end of the project, compost from the collected food scraps will be gifted to restaurants and households for their contributions. The compost will nourish a new generation of crops, fostering a cycle of growth that echoes the spirit of our circular economy.

Chin Pik Wun is a graphic designer by trade with over 20 years in professional and volunteer roles. Pik Wun uses her design skills to support environmental and societal causes. Committed to sustainability, her work focuses on conservation and community.

Boxcutter Collective

Boxcutter Collective is a New York City-based puppet troupe founded in 2016. The founding members had worked together at Bread and Puppet Theater, one of the oldest nonprofit theatre companies in the United States, founded in 1963. Boxcutter Collective strives to harness the power of puppet shows for the forces of good, engaging with students, artists and other participants of all ages to create work that has been performed in theatres, schools, libraries, parks and on the streets.

Over the years, they have been awarded grants to support their boundary-pushing work, including the Jim Henson Foundation Grant, New York State Council for the Arts Grant, AgitArte's Sustaining Grant for Political Artists and more.

As the colossal figures traverse the winding city streets, they breathe life into the stories of these communities, beckoning you to witness their living histories.

Meet The Communities

Taman Sri Janggus, Machang Bubuk, Batuk Mertajam

Over the past 20 to 25 years, this area has transformed from an oil palm plantation into a vibrant residential area, home to approximately 700 households.

An area rich with history, nature and culture, one of its most renowned landmarks is the Minor Basilica of St. Anne, whose origin can be traced back to as early as 1833. The annual Feast of St. Anne draws visitors from near and far, adding to the community's vibrant cultural tapestry. Nearby areas like Cherok To'kun and Bukit Seraya house a vacant dam and reservoir from the British administration era—popular spots for hikers to breathe the fresh air and gaze at scenic views.

Ban Liau, Bukit Tambun, Batu Kawan

Ban Liau, derived from the Hokkien word meaning "net house", is a quaint fishing village in Seberang Perai, Penang. Here, fishermen dry their nets in front of their houses every day after returning from sea.



Formerly a coastal swamp, Ban Liau holds a history that spans 100 years. Transporting rocks, red clays and weeds from the nearby hill, the villagers themselves layered the swamp to create solid land for house building. This tranquil village is within Bukit Tambun, a suburb famous for its seafood and delectable Tambun biscuits. For generations, the humble locals have celebrated the 15th day of the Chinese lunar calendar with a lantern parade and cultural performances.

Fairuz Sulaiman

Fairuz, an interdisciplinary artist from Selangor, works with both digital and analogue visual formats. His practice includes creating visuals for large displays and building facades to complement performance art, theatre productions and live music events. His ongoing project Sekolah Main Wayang features a series of wayang performance workshops for underprivileged and marginalised youths, centring their stories.



William Koong

William is a visionary multidisciplinary sculptor born in Ipoh and based in Klang. Renowned for his transformative artistry, his works showcase his specialisation in repurposing metal waste from old car parts and construction materials, transcending conventional boundaries. Creating a captivating blend of the industrial and the imaginative, his pieces

embody a fusion of steampunk, fantasy and science fiction.



Forrest Wong

Born in Seremban, Forrest has been actively creating work that intertwines his personal history with imagination. His works invite viewers to explore the irrational and nonsensical before reaching a full understanding. A finalist for Malaysia's Bakat Muda Sezaman Award in 2019, Forrest participated in Japan's Setouchi Triennale, and has exhibited in Taiwan, United States, Indonesia and Malaysia.



Low Khay Hooi & Wong Siew Jiuan (Art Generation Studio Baiduren)

This dynamic duo are artists, printmakers, illustrators and art teachers. Participating in community art projects is a significant part of their artistic expeditions. Her film Yuni won the grand prix at Toronto International Film Festival 2021. Last year she released Indonesia's first Netflix series Cigarette Girl, following her passion to create more modern and local female-driven stories for a global audience.

This documentary reveals a Malaysian director's deeply personal and harrowing filmmaking journey, marked by traumatic hardships and the silence unjustly imposed on her. Through raw candour, this candid documentary exposes a troubling reality: the suppression of women's voices, the apathy towards women's issues, and an oppressive environment where women are neither seen nor heard.

Chen Yih Wen

Chen Yih Wen is a Malaysian documentary filmmaker and journalist, having worked on international documentaries for Netflix, BBC, History Channel, Crime & Investigation Network, Business Insider and CNA. Currently, she is working on her second feature documentary about marginalised communities in Malaysia, supported by Hot Docs CrossCurrents Fund.

In this small, yet sensitive story, an ordinary nine-year-old Chinese school girl is cautiously introduced to a world she had not imagined before. When she has not seen her mother for a week, her library teacher comforts her and later asks her to take off her dress. The girl is puzzled.

Charlotte Lim

Charlotte Lim is a Malaysian filmmaker whose work draws heavily on the poetic, using her life experiences to shape her filmmaking. Her feature debut My Daughter received the Jury Award at the Marrakech International Film Festival 2009, and was praised as 'pure cinema'.
