Momo is a clever yet naughty little boy. He often teases his friends, and no one likes to be with him. One day, he receives a strange gift and accidentally enters the magical world of fantasy, where Baddie, an evil wizard, lives. He wants to catch an arrogant child with no friends, which describes Momo to a T! Baddie captures Momo and wants to put him in an ugly soup to make the world an ugly kingdom, forever. Fortunately, there is also a good witch, the kind-hearted Goodie. To prevent Baddie from turning the magic world into an ugly kingdom forever, Goodie decides to rescue Momo.

Originally written and directed by the co-founder of Hong Kong-based PIP Cultural Industries, Jim Chim, "Oops! Belle the Witch is Gone!" will be presented at the George Town Festival 2022 by Penang-based theatre company Noise Performance House, in conjunction with the 21st anniversary of the company's founding. The George Town Festival 2022 edition of the theatre will be produced and directed by Noise Performance House's co-founder Chin Teo.

# A Notional History

An activist, a journalist, and a performer excavate school textbooks, inherited memories, and video interviews of exiled revolutionaries – uncovering erasures, exclusions, and questions around the Malayan Emergency. They investigate and speculate on the possible histories for a 'New Malaysia', intersecting the personal, the national, and the notional. Devised and performed by Fahmi Reza, Faiq Syazwan Kuhiri and Rahmah Pauzi, "A Notional History" is a response to a critical moment in Malaysia – the publishing of new, official history textbooks – following the 2018 general elections where citizens voted out the Barisan Nasional government after 61 years in power. Directed by Mark Teh, this revolutionary documentary performance takes back Malaysian history and gives it a new perspective.

## SERENITY: A Glimpse Through the Traditional Lenses

Presented by Marrow Collective and performed by interdisciplinary artist Kar Kah Chan, in collaboration with cinematographer Joie Koo, dancers Ker Yee Teng and Winnie Tay Yi Xuan, Malaysian composer Yii Kah Hoe, and visual artist Sim Hoi Ling, "SERENITY: A Glimpse Through the Traditional Lenses" is a screening session, a performance, and a brief workshop that aims to connect traditional art forms with contemporary practices in dance while allowing audiences to discover the vibrancy and diversities of the Malaysian art scene. Inspired by two classical tragic female characters in kabuki and Chinese opera – Sagi Musume (Heron Maiden) and Yokihi (Lady Yang Gui Fei) – which were famously recreated and portrayed by Kabuki actor Bando Tamasaburo V, the contemporary dance work of the programme aims to reflect on the commonalities and aesthetics created from the memories of kabuki and Chinese opera. Meanwhile, the screening session is a 15-minute site-specific performance and digital work that captures still images and subtle movements in contrast with the traditional houses of Malaysia, relocated in Rimbun Dahan, the home of architect Hijjas Kasturi and his wife Angela. The programme culminates with a brief workshop to introduce the artist's practice to the general public and art communities in Penang.

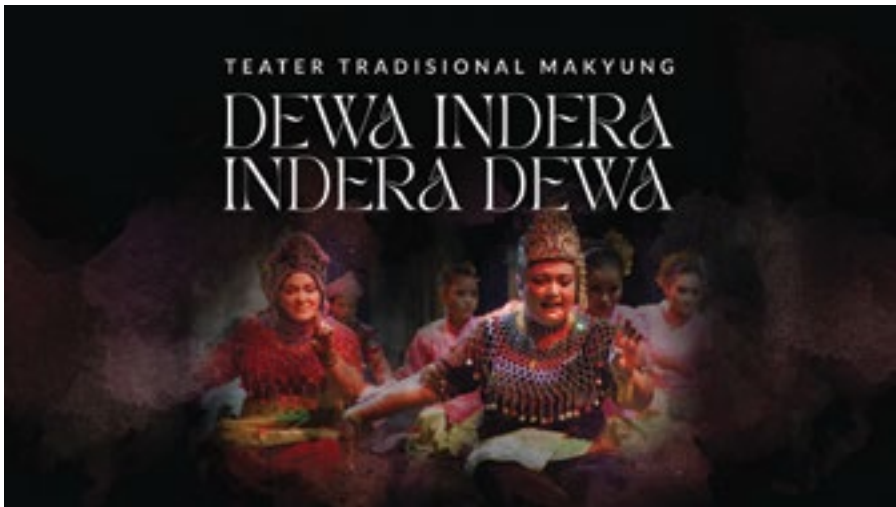

The ancient art form of Mak Yong, an ancient Malay theatre genre performed for centuries in the royal courts of Kelantan up until the 1920s, has arrived at the George Town Festival 2022 and it is a triumph of intangible cultural heritage preservation. Kumpulan Seri Makyung USM is bound to astound with Teater Tradisional Makyung 'DEWA INDERA INDERA DEWA', a Mak Yong story which tells the tales of two princes – Dewa Indera and Indera Dewa – vying for the love of Puteri Selindungan Daun, whom they saved from a jinn. Teater Tradisional Makyung 'DEWA INDERA INDERA DEWA' addresses complex themes, such as sibling rivalry, royal tradition and the world of jinn (genie) through stylised dance and action, hypnotising music, and enigmatic costumes, and will leave audiences awestruck, spellbound, and deeply satisfied.
